PLAYING AREA

The tournament was held in the CENACOM Convention Center.

The playing hall was pretty good, with enough space for players & spectators and excelente air-conditioning and lighting.

A large digital countdown device was installed in the playing hall 30 minutes before the begining of each round. The Chief Arbiter and FIDE Technical Delegate were regularly announcing in the playing zone that 5 to 1 minute was left for the games start. Mineral water, coffee and tea were provided to the participants in the playing zone.

PLAYING SYSTEM	The games were played in 11 rounds, swiss system, envolving about 450 players.
PAIRINGS	The pairings were published on the Chess-Results web site after the end of the previous round. The pairing was performed in the swiss manager software.
